# This Week's Really Big Story

#### Coverup at courthouse

Charges of a cover-up at the Republican-controlled Hamilton County Courthouse were being shouted as soon as the Grand Jury's findings were announced. Here's what the press release

said:

"In a day long hearing, the Jury heard from Sheriff's investigators, Officials, and Employees of the Building Commission and evidence acquired from WCPO-TV as to every aspect of the case. After

an extended deliberation, the Jury determined to return no indictment.

All Grand Juries, however, are controlled and directed by the prosecution. They see everything that the prosecution wishes them to see. They don't see anything that the prosecution does not wish them to see. Grand Juries need only probable cause to indict. The public is always frustrated because there is no legal &

way to see what was or was not-presented to the Grand Jury. That's the way it works.

There have been many rumors that the reason there would be no guilty finding is that the GOP was afraid that if the accused were put on the witness stand and told everything they knew, that they would be naming names and implicating higher-ups.

Channel 9 reporter Jay Shatz appeared to rattle Prosecutor Art Ney when he said that his sources had said that the Grand Jury hadn't even been shown the tapes.

#### Business as usual

The more things change, the more they stay the same. In fact, it's deja vu all over again.

In a stinging rebuke to their investigative efforts, last week a grand jury determined to return no indictment on criminal charges against four Hamilton County building inspec-tors shown playing golf on a Channel 9 "I-Team" news report during ratings week.

Channel 9 had tapes showing building inspectors playing golf. They had records showing false and incomplete reports. They had 'evidence." There was no way that these guys were going to get off. But they did. Because the Grand Jury found no criminal wrongdoing.

All of which wouldn't have been so embarrassing, but it was the same day that Cincinnati Magazine published an article showing what a great job the "I-Team" newshounds were doing.

Talk about your bad timing.

Channel 9 has a right to be upset. But if they'd studied their Hamilton County history,

they would have known better.

More than a decade ago, Norman Murdock was accused of running the Reagan campaign out of the commissioners offices at the courthouse. The Enquirer ran a front-page picture of a check written by The Committee to Elect Republicans at 1000 Main Street. And somehow, Simon Leis (then prosecutor) concluded that there had been no criminal wrongdoing.

And what was Channel 9 and the rest of the news media doing at the time? They were making excuses for Murdock. Presumably because it was The Enquirer's story.

And what's the rest of the news media doing this time? No, they aren't making excuses for what looks like "just another cover-up." But they aren't doing anything to help, either. I'll take more than a few editorial cartoons.

Sure, The Post ran an editorial the next day, but one wonders if they would have rallied around Channel 9, if the station were not another Scripps Howard property. The Enquirer did the story, but through Sunday, there was no editorial outrage. There was no passion.

There wasn't even any sarcasm.

And Channels 5 and 12 were gloating because there would be no Emmy for the "I-Team,"

without any indictments.

What is needed, of course, is a realization by members of the news media that investigative journalism is not just something to do during ratings periods. And when someone uncovers a tip of an iceberg, everyone else should begin chipping away at it.

Once again, the selfishness of the news media has resulted in politics as usual continuing because of their business as usual.

People at the courthouse aren't really worried about the news media taking an occasional fling at investigative journalism.

But they would be up all night if the new media put self interests aside and suddenly started working together for the public good.

from her job as at WKRC-TV.


"I don't blame the

of her contract expires?




